

Infusion Therapy Orientation

Medicines Management & Infusion Therapy Competency Training.

The Medicines Management Competency is a certification process by which all nursing and midwifery staff demonstrate competency in his/her practice of medication administration. Staff new to the hospital and/or staff returning to work are invited to attend a 3hour training to infusion therapy during their orientation period. Training will include:

- Medicines Management Competency requirements
- Medication Safety
- Notes on Injectable Drugs (NOIDS)
- Arcomed infusion pumps & IV lines
- Methods of IV Administration
- Transfusion medicine






Instructions for Enrolment Through the Self-Service Kiosk (Te Whatu Ora Whanganui Staff Only)


- 1. Log into the self-service Kiosk link on the intranet or internet pages

- 9. You will receive a confirmation e-mail when your study leave is approved






Te Whatu Ora Whanganui Campus Map

Aim/purpose

'Let's Talk' is a brief, easy to use, evidence-based approach that trains professionals to a structured approach to encourage discussion with parents/caregivers who experience mental illness/addiction regarding their parenting, wellbeing, and development of their children. Divided into four modules, this package provides the clinician a practical tool to use with parents to explore strengths and vulnerabilities of each child in their whānau/family and possible ideas on how to strengthen strengths and address vulnerabilities. The approach views the parent as the expert on their own children. This stance empowers the parent to reflect on their parenting in the context of the mental illness/addiction they experience. 'Let's Talk' aims to make this conversation a routine part of the alliance between parents and professionals where they can explore the wellbeing and development of children and how their parent's mental illness/addiction is understood by them.

Benefits, stance, mental health, addressing parental resistance, overview of process, developmental logs, strengths and vulnerabilities, empowering parents, readiness principles, and practitioner reflections.

Professional Supervision Training



2x Day Workshops

Aim/purpose

- Introduction/refresher to be able to provide professional supervision
- Professional supervision is for anyone who wants to build regular reflective practice into their work role.
- Develop your clinical and professional supervision skills with a strong focus on reflective practice
- Examine the concept, role, purpose, and benefits of supervision in a wide range of professions
- Obtain certificate of completion of professional supervision training

Learning Objectives/ Content

- Reflect on experience of providing and/or being a recipient of Supervision throughout professional practice.
- Introduction to the synergistic supervision model and describe how the model applies in practise
- Opportunity to practise specific elements of supervision around contracting, agenda building, working on an issue (Using Heron's 6 Interventions Model), reviewing – and have received appreciative feedback from their peers in a small group and one-to-one setting.
- Undertake two practise sessions of Supervision and completed a structured brief written reflection exercise around these practise sessions.
- Opportunity to consolidate and demonstrate skills learnt through attending the additional oneday follow-up event, where skills learnt from the initial two days are practised in depth and feedback provided by peers using a detailed checklist with verbal and written feedback components

Single Session Family Consultation



Target	This study day is for: Anyone who works with parents/caregivers who
Audience	experience Mental Illness or Addictions

Aim/purpose

'Single Session Family Consultation' (developed by the Bouverie Centre in Australia and enhanced by The Werry Centre, New Zealand) is a brief model to encourage family/whānau engagement and inclusion. Participants will gain confidence in how to conduct a Single Session Family Consultation. The focus of this workshop is on engaging with and attending to the needs of family/whānau members in service contexts where the primary client is usually an individual (eg. Adult Mental Health and AOD services). The workshop equips participants with skills in facilitating productive and efficient meetings with families that can be adapted to fit the context of the workplace and client group.

Content

Particular attention to the process of negotiating with the client/consumer about how the family consultation will occur is encouraged to avoid jeopardizing the primary relationship between the client and the practitioner. Participants will practice these skills in a safe and supportive learning environment. Topics also include how to put limits on topic discussion, helping the family/whānau to identify needs, and clarify how they could be involved in care and recovery.
