Temporal artery biopsy – postoperative care and advice

What to expect after the operation

Leave your dressing on until the first morning after the operation, unless your doctor has given different instructions. Please do not replace it.

Once your dressing has been removed, you may need to bathe your wound to remove any dried blood that has collected under the dressing.

You can expect some swelling and/or bruising around your wound site. Your wound should gradually become less swollen and more comfortable.

Bathing the wound

- Boil some water, and then allow it to cool in a cup or bowl
- 2. Wash your hands
- Moisten a clean tissue in the cooled boiled water. Gently use this tissue to wipe along one side of your wound. Throw this tissue away
- Moisten a clean tissue in the cooled boiled water. Gently use this tissue to wipe along the other side of your wound. Throw this tissue away
- 5. Moisten a clean tissue in the cooled boiled water. Wipe across the stitches. Throw this tissue away
- 6. Repeat steps 3, 4 or 5 as necessary until the wound is clean

Contact a Doctor for help if you have any of the following:

You are taking regular pain relief and are still in pain

- You have discharge or bleeding from the wound site
- Any changes in your vision

Pain relief

You may have some mild pain. You can take Paracetamol to help with the pain. A maximum of 2 tablets (1 gram) 4 hourly. No more than 8 tablets (4 grams) in a 24 hour (1day) period.

Avoid taking Aspirin.
